PROPERTY HISTORY

The Inn's structure was built in 1969 on the location of the site of the Pilgrims' first New World settlement. In 1988 it was purchased by the Catania family, who also own and operate the Dan'l Webster Inn & Spa (Sandwich), Cape Coder Resort & Spa (Hyannis) and four Hearth 'n Kettle restaurants throughout Cape Cod and southeastern Massachusetts.

The initial renovation included the addition of the unique Pilgrim Cove Indoor Theme Pool, complete with 80' waterslide, "island" whirlpool and outdoor deck area overlooking historical Plymouth. Ongoing renovations have included redecorating the guest rooms, meeting rooms, lobby and ballrooms in gracious, comfortable, Colonial-style and the addition of the sophisticated WaterFire Tavern. In 2007 the Beach Plum Spa opened, providing a luxurious new amenity to hotel guest and day visitors.

The Inn is named after John Carver, (before 1576 - 1621), a wealthy merchant who helped arrange the Pilgrim's immigration to America in 1620, chartering the *Mayflower*. As one of the Pilgrim Fathers, he became the first governor of Plymouth Colony. He was governor for less than a year before his death.

AREA HISTORY

Plymouth, known as "America's Hometown", is also home to Plimouth Plantation, Plymouth Rock and the *Mayflower II* (a life-size replica of the original ship). The town is located in southeastern Massachusetts on Plymouth Bay, about 55 km (34 mi) southeast of Boston. Plymouth was the first permanent European settlement in New England and the site of the first Thanksgiving celebration. It is now a fishing and tourist center with ship-related industries and cranberry-packing houses.

Pilgrims from Europe founded Plymouth on December 21, 1620, establishing a settlement that became the seat of Plymouth Colony in 1633 and a part of Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1691. Pilgrims were English and Dutch Separatists who broke away from the Church of England. Most of these Separatists were farmers without political standing. They sailed from England in a ship named the *Mayflower*, and although they planned to sail to Virginia, violent storms sent them north. They first landed at what is now Provincetown Harbor and while exploring the coast of Cape Cod, experienced hostile encounters with the local natives. The *Mayflower* sailed westward into the calm waters of Plymouth Bay where they discovered cleared fields, empty of population because the local Wampanoags had been decimated by European diseases brought by French and British fishermen. Plymouth Rock is reported to be the location of their first steps upon shore. The Pilgrims almost starved the first year, had it not been for Squanto, an emissary from Massasoit, a Wampanog Chief, who showed the newcomers how to plant corn, where to fish and other survival methods. The Pilgrims and Native Americans celebrated a harvest dinner together in 1621 establishing the first "Thanksgiving."
